TONIGHT'S GAME

The Senators and RubberDucks play game three of the Senators' final home series of the 2017 season. The 'Ducks evened the series with their game two 10-9 win following Taylor Murphy's go -ahead two-run home run with the club down to their final out in the ninth. Akron leads the season series 6-5. The Senators have just six games remaining in 2017, as they finish the season with four games against Altoona.

AUGUST ACCOMPLISHMENTS

If the Senators win the final two games against Akron then they will finish with their first winning month of the season. With another 11 hits Tuesday night, the Senators raised their team batting average in the month .282, the highest mark in the Eastern League. In addition the Senators' 29 home runs are the most they have hit in a month this season and is third most in the Eastern League in August.

EXTRA INNINGS

Stephen Perez gave the Senators their third walk-off win of the season with his game-winning RBI single in the bottom of the 12th of the series opener. The game marked just the sixth extra inning game of the season for the Senators, the fewest such games played by any team in the Eastern League.

ROBLES HITTING STREAK

After his first inning single Monday night, **Victor Robles** has now recorded a hit in 16 consecutive games, tying Neftali Soto for the longest Senators hitting streak of the season. The streak is tied for the third longest in the Eastern League this season. Prior to this season, no Senators player had recorded a hitting streak of at least 16 games since Jesus Feliciano's 17-game streak in 2005. Robles is batting .403 during the 16 games.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS

Jose Marmolejos was named Eastern League player of the week for week of August 21-26. Marmolejos is the first Senator to be awarded player of the week honors this season. Marmolejos led all Eastern League players RBIs (9), runs scored (8), and total bases (23) last week and tied for the league lead in hits (12) and extra-base hits (6). He also finished ranked among the weekly EL leaders in batting average (.462-2nd) and slugging percentage (.885-2nd)

MARMO HITTING STREAK

Jose Marmolejos extended his hitting streak to 13 games with his first inning single in the series opener. Marmolejos is the fourth Senators player this year to have a hitting streak of ten or more games, joining Victor Robles, Corban Joseph and Neftali Soto.

SENATORS STARTING PITCHER
