TONIGHT'S GAME

The Senators play their final series of the season as they take on the Altoona Curve in a four-game set at PNG Field. The Senators dropped the series opener 6-5 as they could not finish the comeback after falling behind 5-0 after six innings. This is the first meeting between the two teams since the Curve took two out of three from the club July 17-19. Altoona holds an 9-5 edge in the season series.

SAME AS IT EVER WAS

The Senators have played three consecutive games that have finished with a final score of 6-5. In each game, the Senators have trailed by at least four runs entering either the seventh or eighth innings. The club came back to win Saturday's game on a walk-off home run by **Yadiel Hernandez**, the club's Eastern League high sixth win when trailing entering the ninth inning. The club has come up one run short in each of the previous two games.

RAUDY GETS THE CALL

Raudy Read was promoted to the Nationals on Monday, becoming the fourth 2017 Senator to be called up the Major Leagues (**Andrew Stevenson**, **Erick Fedde** and **Adrian Sanchez**). The catcher played 108 games with the Senators and led the club with 17 home runs, the most by a Senators player since 2014. **Taylor Gushue** was promoted to the Senators from Potomac to fill Read's roster spot.

SENATORS HITTING STREAKS

After his pinch-hit single, **Victor Robles** has now recorded a hit in 18 consecutive games, the longest Senators hitting streak of the season. The streak is tied for the fifth longest streak in Senators history (**Lance Belen** in 1987, **Josh Labandeira** in 2004) and it's tied for the longest in the Eastern League this season. Robles is batting .397 during the 18 games. **Jose Marmolejos** also extended his hitting streak to 16 after finishing 2-2.

AUGUST ACCOMPLISHMENTS

The Senators led the Eastern League with a .279 batting average during the month of August. In addition, the Senators' 31 home runs were the most they have hit in a month this season and was tied for third most in the Eastern League in August.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS

Jose Marmolejos was named Eastern League player of the week for week of August 21-26. Marmolejos is the first Senator to be awarded player of the week honors this season.

SENATORS STARTING PITCHER

Kyle McGowin starts game two for the Senators. The right-hander is 1-5 with a 7.17 ERA across eight starts with the Senators this season. McGowin went a season-high seven innings in his last start, while only allowing one run on six hits. For more information on McGowin please visit game two of the game notes.

ALTOONA STARTING PITCHER

The Curve counter with starter **Alex McRae**. The right-hander is 10-5 with a 3.67 ERA across 26 games and 24 starts with the Curve this season. McRae tossed six innings of one run ball against Richmond in his last start on August 28. The 24-year-old was originally drafted by the Pirates in the 10th round of the 2014 draft from Jacksonville University.
